and He whispered come with me.*


*With tearful eyes we watched you suffer

Tom Morrisey, a beloved husband, father, and friend, passed away peacefully at his home in Louisburg, Kansas, on August 20th, 2025 at the age of 83. Tom was born April 10th, 1942 in Wellington, Kansas to John (Jack) and Mada Lou Morrisey. Tom led a life filled with warmth, laughter and dedication to his family and community.
