Donnie Dean Brownfield, 77, of Sedalia, passed away Tuesday, May 5, 2026, at Boone Hospital Center following a period of declining health.

He was born October 22, 1948, in Sedalia, a son of Vernon and Edna (Paxton) Brownfield. On June 12, 1970, in Sedalia, he married Beverly “Sue” Wheeler, who survives of the home.

Donnie was a 1966 graduate of Smith-Cotton High School and attended State Fair Community College. He served six years in the National Guard as a cook.
