Life Reflections

Early Life and Academic Pursuits

Stacey Lynn Fowler was born on November 9, 1963, in St. Louis, Missouri, to Earline (Evans) and Nathaniel “Johnny” Fowler. As their only child, she was raised with strong values, deep love, and an abiding sense of purpose. Her parents, who played a foundational role in shaping the remarkable woman she became, preceded her in death. She received her education in the St. Louis Public Schools and the Hazelwood School District before earning a Bachelor of Arts in Women’s Studies from the University of Missouri–Columbia. Her studies also included Home Economics, Journalism, and Graphic Design, reflecting her curiosity, creativity, and commitment to excellence.

A Career Dedicated to Empowering the Community

For more than twenty years, Stacey dedicated her life to helping people find better opportunities and build stronger communities. She worked hard to make sure small businesses, especially those owned by women and minorities, had the support they needed to grow and succeed. Through her work with the St. Louis Development Corporation (SLDC) and, earlier, with the St. Louis Agency on Training and Employment (SLATE), she helped connect people with jobs, training, and the tools to create a better life for themselves and their families.

Stacey’s care for others went far beyond her job. She proudly served three terms as 2nd Ward Alderperson for the City of Pine Lawn, speaking up for those who needed a voice. She will be remembered for her steady leadership and the way she touched lives with her compassion and dedication.

A Legacy Anchored in Faith

Stacey accepted Christ at an early age and lived a life firmly rooted in faith. She was nurtured spiritually at Olivet Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of Rev. James C. Davis. She later became a devoted member of Mt. Nebo Missionary Baptist Church, led by Rev. Dwight A. Davis, where her faith continued to guide her service. Behind the scenes, Stacey facilitated the Sunday morning worship livestream, helping to extend the service beyond the church walls. Stacey’s life was a quiet yet powerful testimony of faith in action, serving God and her community with humility, consistency, and love.

Stacey was called home on January 15, 2026. She leaves to cherish her memory a loving aunt Dwinderlin Evans; her uncles, Donald Evans (Brenda) and Robert Evans (Selena); Otha Fowler (Gwen); and a host of cousins, colleagues, friends, and community members. Her legacy endures in the countless lives she touched and the doors she helped open for future generations.
