Virginia "Newt" Fullard Gaymon

Virginia Fullard Gaymon was born on March 26, 1931 in the Brogdon Community of Sumter County, South Carolina to the late Freddie and Azalee Wilson Fullard. After the untimely death of her mother, she was reared in the loving home of her maternal grandparents, Altamont and Dilcie Harvin Wilson.

Virginia was educated in the Sumter County school system. She married the love of her life, Lang Gaymon, on December 27, 1955. Within this union, they reared Cherrie Brand and Cherrie's daughter, Inasia Giddings Barone. Virginia and Lang were married for 50 years, until his passing in 2006.

As a young, married couple, Virginia and Lang migrated to the north, landing in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Virginia loved Philadelphia, specifically South Philly, where they made their home.

While in Philadelphia, she joined the Lovely Baptist Church, under the pastorate of the late Wilbur Crew. She was the pianist for the Lovely Baptist Church Gospel Choir. She was also an integral part of the church kitchen staff. She was one of the lead cooks and the chief baker. She was known for her southern cooking and her fantastic, made from scratch cakes.

Virginia was employed by the Pennsylvania Hospital, from which she retired, after over 35 years of service. After retirement, Virginia became a founding member of the South Philly Senior Citizens Community Center. There she used her cooking talents to prepare and serve meals to the senior citizens in the neighborhood. She served in this capacity until the closing of the center.

Virginia loved to travel. Her favorite spot: Atlantic City, New Jersey; but she also enjoyed cruising with her family and friends.

In 2022, Virginia relocated back South Carolina to reside with her niece, Carol Gardner Leaks. She leaves behind a legacy of love and memories to be cherished by: her granddaughter, Inasia Giddings (Anthony) Barone; one great-grandson, Luca Barone; one sister, Azalee Fullard Brand, her niece/caregiver, Carol Gardner (Stanley) Leaks; a very special cousin, Della Sherod; and a host of other nieces, nephews and relatives.

She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, Cherrie, and brothers and sisters from her father's subsequent remarriage.
