Anthony graduated from Taft High School in 1970. His first son who is also named Anthony was born on February 28, 1972. Driven to take care of his son, Anthony sought employment and was hired by the City of Cincinnati's Highway Maintenance Division. He was later transferred to Riverfront Stadium where his journey of life began to transcend. He was assigned tasks in which he had limited knowledge in troubleshooting, but adversity would not prevent him from acquiring the following skillsets: plumber, electrician, carpenter and mason. He also had the pleasure of escorting musicians for the annual Jazz Festival across the field to the performance stage. He joined the United States Marines in 1976 in which he was honorably discharged.
