His Story • His Love

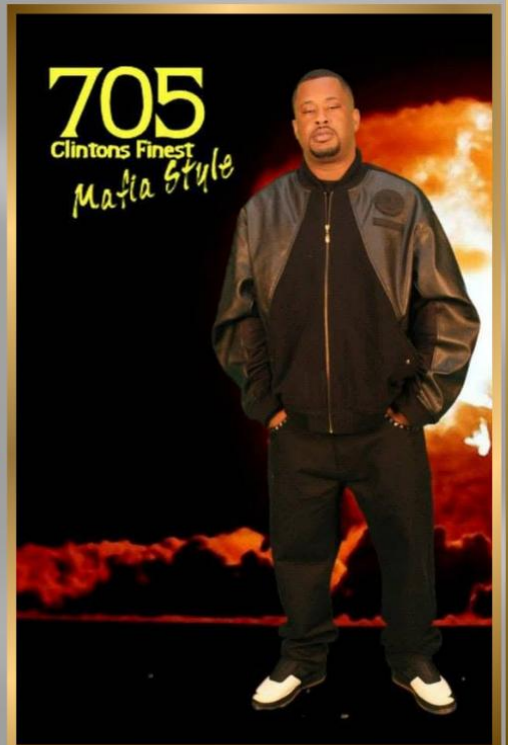
Mr. Maurice A. Anderson was born on July 17, 1978

you suppose to still be here not there.

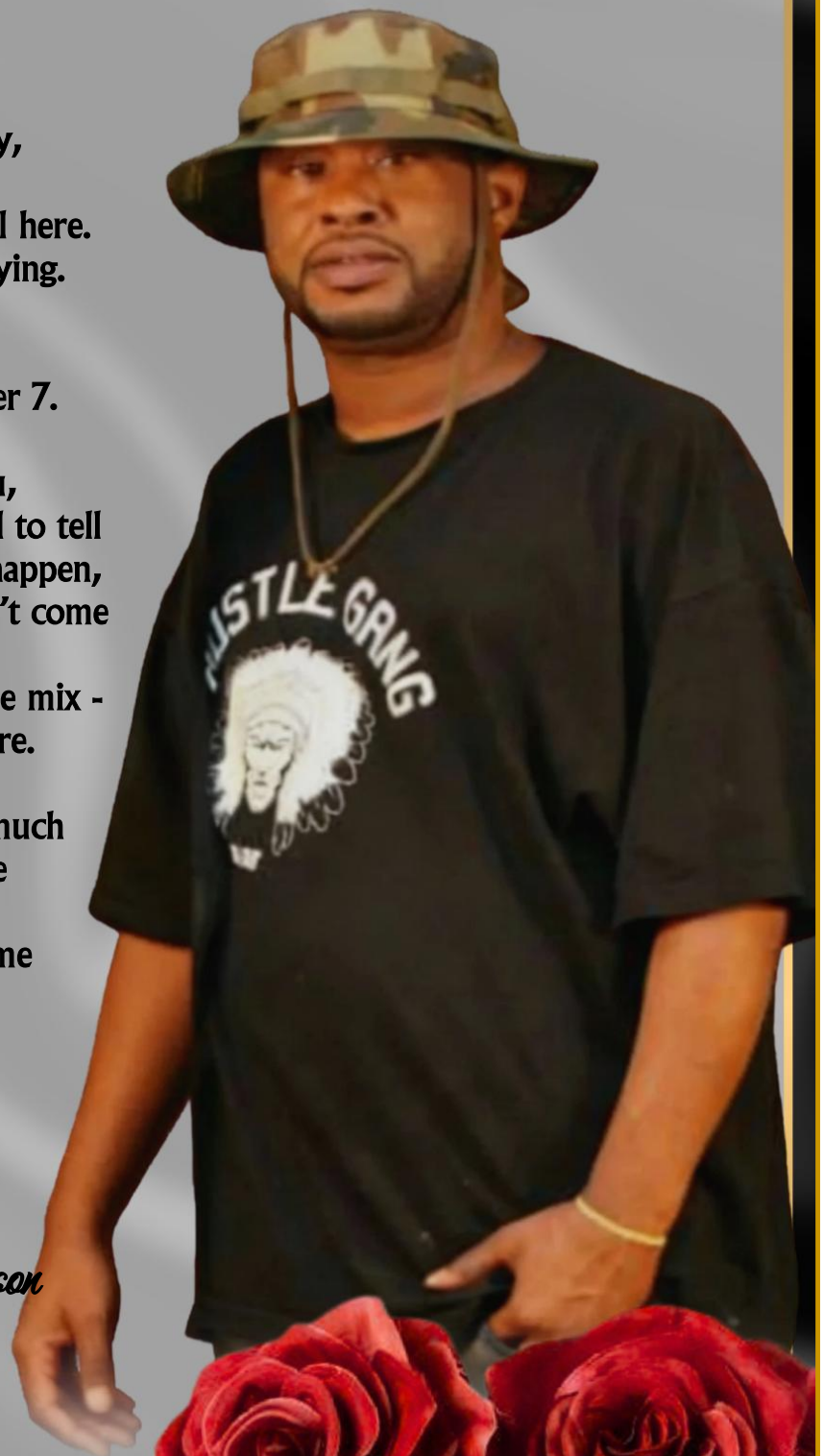
I'm going to let you go and get that much
