Obituary

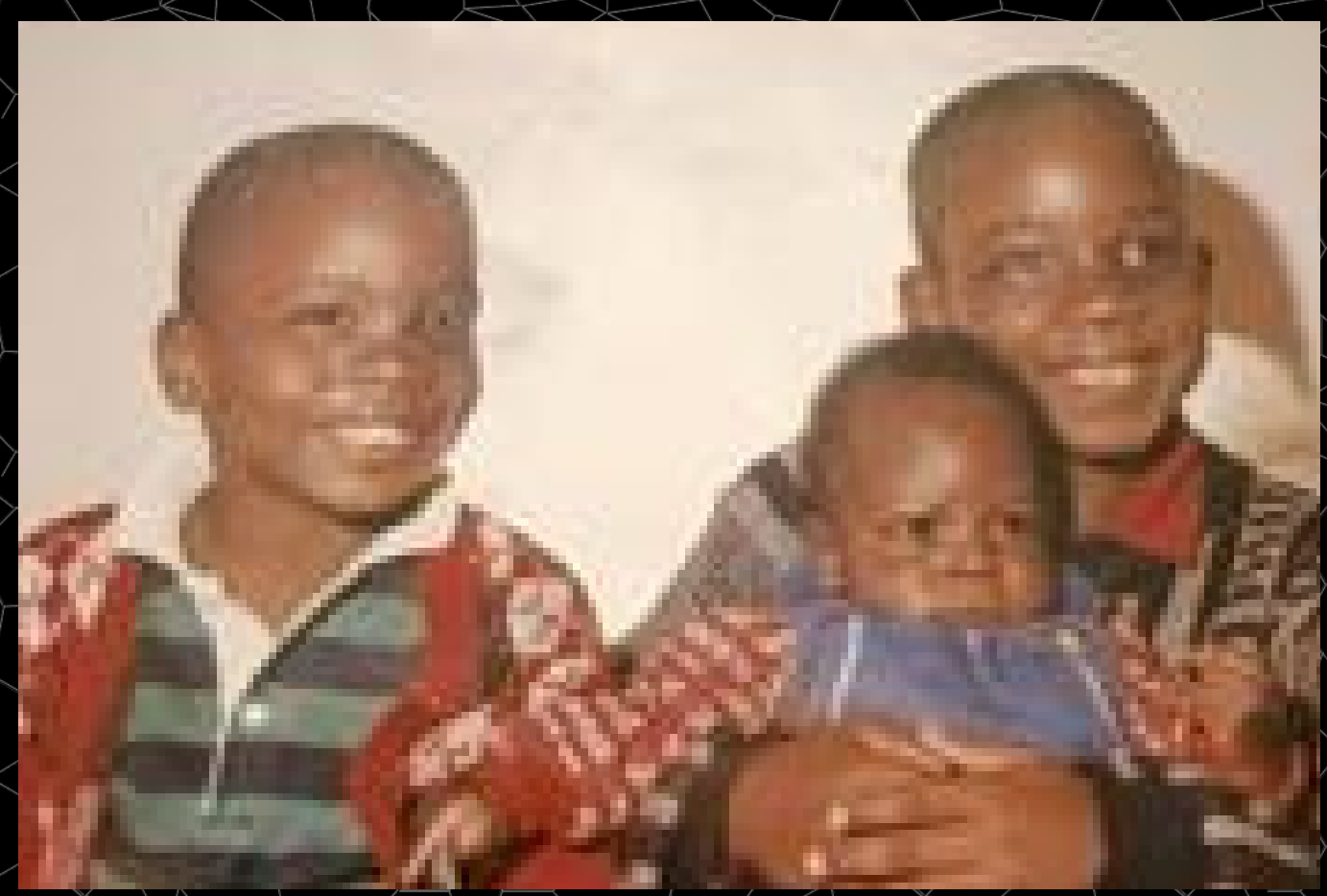
Jeremy Allen Tripp 41, of Boston MA, passed away unexpectedly on December 11, 2023.

Jeremy Allen Tripp, affectionately known as “Burn” by his family and friends was born in Boston Massachusetts on August 21, 1982. He was the second of four boys. Jeremy attended R A Allen elementary school, Timothy middle school, and Madison Park high school. As a child Jeremy developed a love for art and carpentry. Jeremy had a knack for assembling anything you could imagine. Jeremy loved to draw and possessed the skill to draw freehand. His artistic skill and talent were recognized by his mother and teachers and lead him to receive an art scholarship from Mayor Thomas Menino. In addition, to Jeremy’s artistic capabilities, he was very athletic. Jeremy played football, basketball, and participated in track and field on several school teams. As an adult Jeremy held various jobs.

Jeremy is remembered as having a heart of gold, he loved selflessly and freely. He always made himself readily available to anyone who was in need. Those who know Jeremy describe him as being a person who would “literally take his shirt off his back, go without it, and give it to someone who needed it”. They recall times Jeremy put this in action. Once Jeremy came home from school without his shoes because, he gave them to a man he met on the street who did not have any. Secondly, when Jeremy’s family lived on Center Street his mother came home to people sitting in her living room who were homeless. Jeremy invited them in and gave them food because they did not have any.

Jeremy loved his family. He was the father of two sons: Jeremy Carl Tripp Taylor (JC), 19 years old and Jerion Allen Tripp Billingsley, 15 years old. Jeremy leaves to mourn him, his Mummy Valarie Tripp, his Father Courtney Kelton, and his brothers Courtney, Chad, and Andre Tripp. Jeremy is also survived by his grandmother’s Vermell Bell and Sophia Taylor, his bonus father Nelson Bell and his Aunt and Uncle Kimberly and Stephan Bell. Jeremy also leaves to mourn a host of aunts, uncles, cousins, and friends that love him dearly.
