



1940 - 2025



James Thomas Patton, son of James "Louie" Patton and Sarah Opel Campbell, was born January 23, 1940 in Dixon, Missouri. He departed this life, August 27, 2025, in Lake

Regional Hospital, Osage Beach, Missouri at the age of eighty-five years, seven months and four days.

On September 26, 1959 in Decaturville, Missouri, he was united in marriage to Frances Lee Crall by Rev. Buck Marler and to this union two children were born; together they shared fifty-nine years of marriage.
