REMEMBERING NATE

Nathanial Gerard Hill, lovingly known to everyone as Nate, was born November 23, 1988 in Washington, DC to Deborah Plummer and Gregory Hill. He departed this life on June 2, 2026, after a long battle with heart disease, surrounded by his loving family.

Nate married Nataviya Martin on June 4, 2018. From this union two daughters were born, Nalani and Naila. They were his world. He was definitely a “girl dad”. He always said he wanted to make sure his family was taken care of.

Nate was educated in the DC Public School System. While attending Anacostia Senior High School he ran track. He graduated from Anacostia in 2005.

Nate always had an interest in art which led him to attend the Art Institute of Washington. While in art school he started working with his uncle in the electrical field, which led him to pursue a career as an electrician. He was dedicated to the profession. He was proud to be called an electrician. His career as an electrician started in 2012 with Done Deal Electric, PEC Electric, and Stump Electric. After working for others, Nate branched out on his own as an entrepreneur and started NGH Electric.

In 2016, Nate and several of his friends began a podcast V.S.O.P. (Very Solid & Original Podcast). On this platform they spoke on different topics which many of the audiences benefited from.

Nathaniel was a loving son, husband, father, brother, cousin, nephew, uncle and friend. He was always willing to help when needed. He held his cousins just as close as his siblings. He would often ask “are you alright?”.

At the height of covid, Nate was diagnosed with heart disease. Within that time, he was told that his heart was functioning at 17%. In 2021 he had an L-vad installed until a new heart became available for a transplant. In August 2023 Nate was blessed with a new heart. After two years with the new heart, he began to experience complications. He fought long and hard to overcome his condition. At Washington Hospital Center, he was under the care of an incredible transplant team. A team that ultimately became his friends.

Nate’s life was a testament to love, friendship, strength, and compassion. Sometimes he tried to have a strong exterior, but he was really a softy.

He is survived by his wife Nataviya and two daughters Nalani and Naila; mother Deborah Plummer and father Gregory Hill; three

sisters Adrienne Robinson (Stephen), Ronnetta Benforado (Travis), Tamaria Hill and two brothers Antoine Clarke and Darnell Hill; brother-in-law Vontrell Ingram, mother-in-law Keithyvonne Ingram, father-in-law Nathaniel Martin, a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins and many friends. He had a close relationship with his cousins, some he talked with almost every day, to name a few Michael, James, Katrell, Titus, and Charlie, and close family friend Wydell.

He was preceded in death by his grandparents Flossie and Charles Plummer and Juanita Hicks.
