Life Reflections

Hilton Eugene Jordan was born in Lynn, Massachusetts on July 16, 1928, to the late Clarice (Martindale) Jordan and Percy Eugene Jordan. He was their sixth child at that time. As a young boy he was very inquisitive and industrious. Hilton often told stories of holding jobs at a relatively tender age, being fastidious, even then regarding his earnings. He grew up when things weren't always easy but credited his father with providing well for the family. His youthful interests were held in sports and the innocent type of mischief that held a boy's attention and actions. The comical stories that Hilton would share about his older brothers and cousins would keep family members laughing for generations to come.

In the year 1939, the Jordan family moved to Roxbury, Massachusetts as his father, Eld. Percy E. Jordan had taken on the pastorate of Emmanuel Temple Pentecostal Church. A portion of his elementary schooling was spent here as well as junior high and high school. He participated in activities of the day germane to young men growing into adulthood. Hilton left Memorial High School before formally graduating but later in life completed the requirements successfully. He persevered in education and in the 1970's actually received an associate's degree from Mass Bay Community College.

Hilton enrolled in the United States Army during the Korean War. At one time he was stationed in Germany. It was there that he gathered various items of photographic equipment. This fully nurtured his interest in photography. Anyone who knew him was aware of his taking photos at any opportunity. Hilton received an honorable discharge from the Army in 1957 which included reserve status. He would faithfully wear his army veteran's cap. Family members and friends alike will readily tell you that he felt that it afforded him "said privileges" whether at a restaurant, on public transportation or the airport. In the area of employment, Hilton held various jobs from a young age, yet his most memorable experience and the one of which he spoke of repeatedly was his tenure at General Motors Corporation in Framingham, MA. During one winter in the 1950's as he traveled to work in the early morning hours during icy conditions, his car slid right into the body of water in Natick. His survival, which was nothing short of a miracle, was only the Lord! Hilton remained covered by His blood up until his passing at an advanced age.

Upon retirement from General Motors, he spent time to travel. This was one of his great passions. You could find Hilton vacationing and enjoying life. Even up until several years ago, well into his 90's, family members had to get to the point of firmly saying, "No, Hilton, you can't go!" He was very independent, knew how to care of himself, and was strong-willed and determined, but you had to love him for it.

Hilton was a faithful member of The Prince Hall Masons and attained a high office in this order. He was an integral part of its operation and participated fully for many years in all of the activities. It was an important part of his life as evidenced by his support and constant mention of the order's benevolent offerings. He was made a Mason at the John J. Smith Lodge #14 and served as Worshipful Master in 1983.

The Jordan family was and remains to this day active in their faith, as a foundation of truth. Hilton grew up in this manner. He was baptized in the Name of Jesus at 14 years of age. Service unto the Lord was all around him. There could be no way that he could forget his roots. No matter how or where his involvements carried him, his desire to live a life pleasing to Christ shone forth, especially in his latter years. He sought the Lord, fervently, right up until the end.

Hilton was predeceased by his wife Patricia (Jermont) Jordan, siblings Muriel, Percival, Herbert, Vernice, Ederle, Barbara, Joseph and Michael.

He leaves to mourn his loss, a brother Alfred Jordan of Lawrenceville, GA and a sister Ruth (Joseph) Oliver of Sharon, MA as well as a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
