

# Obituary

Michael Kevin Cash (MK) was born on June 9, 1955 to the late Myrtice and Lewis Cash, Sr. On August 1, 2024, nestled in the arms of his loving wife, Dr. Fay, he departed this life at Cincinnati Veterans Hospital.

A product of Cincinnati Public Schools, MK attended Wise Temple Preschool, North Avondale Elementary, Woodward Jr. High and Woodward Sr. High. He was a member of Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA) and played football. He graduated in 1973. MK attended Cincinnati State. He later enlisted in the United States Army and after 12 years of military service, was honorably discharged.

Michael was baptized by Pastor Michael Mangham at First New Shiloh MBC. As a youngster, he excelled in bible studies and delivering fervent prayers. Ordained in Gospel Ministry, Rev. Cash began preaching while stationed at Fort Ord Army Base in Monterey, CA. He served as Minister, Chaplain, Associate Minister and Assistant Pastor at several churches in Seaside, CA. After the passing of Pastor Mangham, he was installed as Senior Pastor at First New Shiloh MBC. He has served in this capacity for 42 years.

Pastor demonstrated the character of Christ in everyday living with messages of empowerment, education, and love. Often described as visionary, there is nothing greater than a visionary led by God. His dedication to excellence and passion to serve extended beyond traditional protocol. Undeniably, Pastor was a faithful servant of God and his life

The greatness of Pastor bespoke volumes when measured by his commitment to service.
