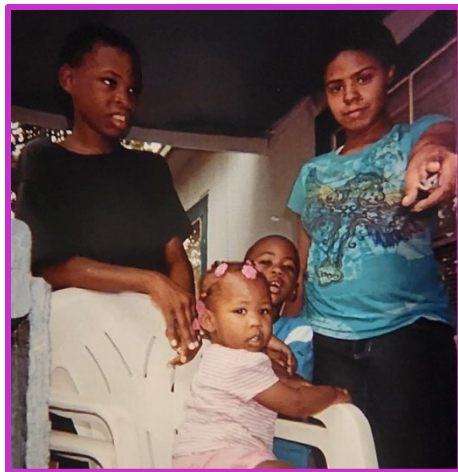
She confessed her belief in Christ at an early age at Galilee M.B. Church under the leadership of Pastor George Daniels and faithfully served on the usher board.
