Faye preceded him in death on September 20, 1992. LeRoy married Janet M. Walbom on June 22, 1993 in the Salt Lake LDS Temple. They ushered at many events held on Temple Square, in the Tabernacle, and in the Conference Center. LeRoy and Janet loved the service they were able to provide on Temple Square, especially during President Hinkley's tenure as President of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Their greatest joy, during that service, was when the Conference Center opened and being able to volunteer on Temple Square 21 out of 23 days of the Salt Lake 2002 Olympics. LeRoy said, "It was a marvelous experience to serve our Father in Heaven in that calling."

Family was everything to LeRoy. His greatest joy and happiness in life was to be around his family. He loved family vacations and any kind of gatherings or holiday celebrations. He loved his and Janet's children, grand-children, and great-grandchildren with all of his heart.

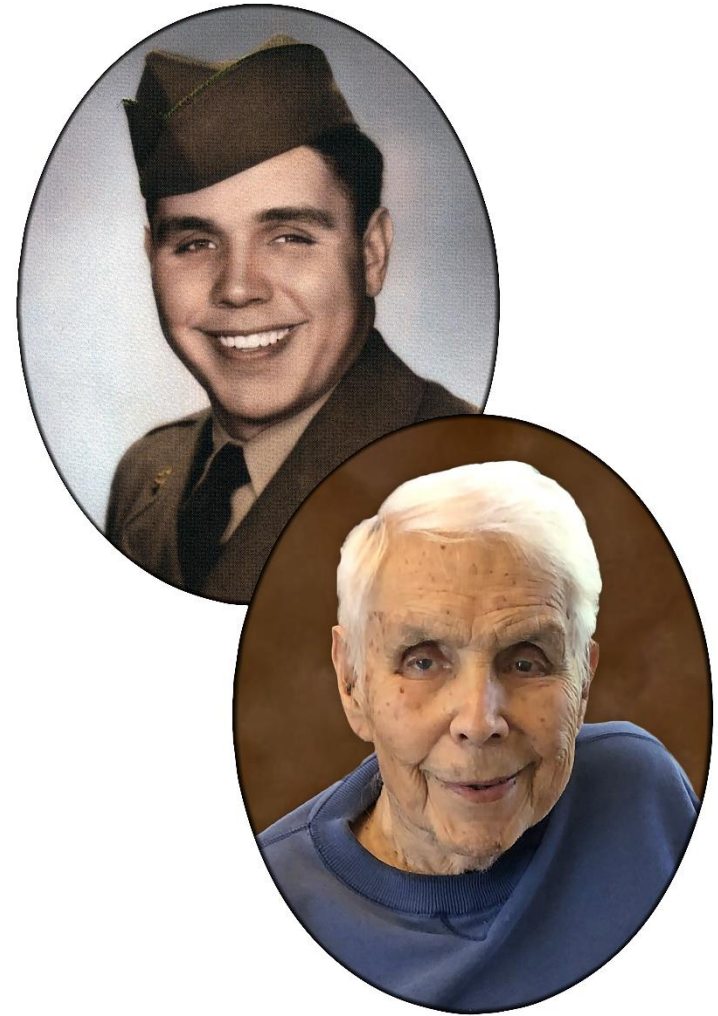
