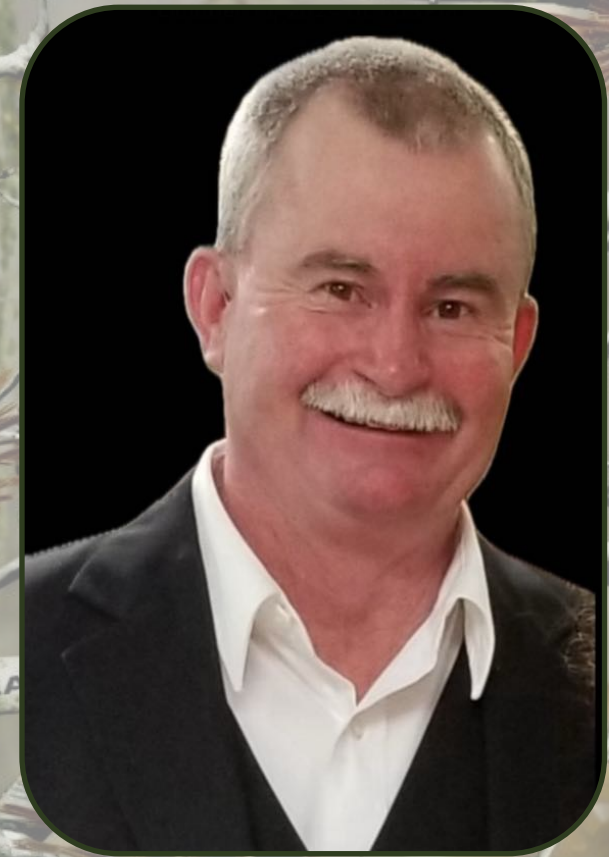


Gone Fishin'
